



Heart Lung and Circulation

Early career publication prize for best review in *Heart Lung and Circulation*

- 1 Applicant must be working towards or less than 5 years post an early career degree (eg, bachelors, masters or PhD) or since award of relevant fellowship (eg, FRACP, FRACS).
- 2 Applicant must be the first author of the Review.
- 3 Applicant's prime contribution to the Review and eligibility must be certified by the Review's senior or corresponding author (not the first author), and the applicant's academic supervisor or Head of Department.
- 4 Before these Reviews are formally evaluated for the Prize, confirmation must be received that the applicant is eligible. Failure to provide confirmation will result in the application being withdrawn from consideration.
- 5 *Heart, Lung and Circulation* will contact the corresponding authors of all eligible articles about the Best Review Prize after print publication of their article. Eligible first authors will be invited to formally submit their application, which will be acknowledged within 3 working days of submission.
- 6 Review must have been published in a print edition of *Heart, Lung and Circulation* in the previous calendar year, i.e. in 2022.
- 7 Important criteria for judging may include novelty, clinical and scientific significance, clarity and quality of data presentation and interpretation. In addition, the number of online downloads per comparable time from date of online publication and citation on Scopus will be taken into consideration.
- 8 All eligible Reviews will be graded. The highest graded Reviews will be discussed and voted on by a panel consisting of the Editor-in-Chief and Section Editors.
- 9 Should there be a conflict of interest, editors on the Judging panel may be allowed to comment on Reviews but not to vote on the final decision.
- 10 The yearly prize shall be valued at \$1,000.
